NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: One (1)

DUTIES: Under the direction of the Chief State Veterinarian, verifies the eligibility of horses to receive approved race day medication and prepares necessary paperwork and documentation. Maintains detailed records of horses that have bled or declared on Lasix (furosemide). Determines Lasix treatment eligibility using certification and declaration documents and past performance Lasix use. Prepares a Lasix administration sheet for eligible horses. Maintains treatment sheets with dosages of previous Lasix treatments. Assists State Veterinarians with compiling and maintaining lists pertaining to eligibility to race, shockwave therapy treatments, nerving, horses late for Lasix, and other various medical treatments. Assists the State Veterinarians as needed with phone calls, typing any letters, forms or other documents; and entering any other information into databases. Enters pertinent health information of horses (i.e. Coggins and vaccinations) into national databases (i.e. InCompass or E-track depending on the breed of the horse). This position may also require travel between office locations and non-traditional work hours, on an as-needed basis, including evenings on short deadlines for certain assignments, with or without advance notice, and may require travel to perform the aforementioned responsibilities.

REQUIREMENTS

NOTE: Applicants must meet one of the following or a combination of both experience and education. Thirty (30) semester hour credits are equal to one (1) year of relevant experience.

Five (5) years of experience in the licensing of personnel and participants of the racing industry; or, five (5) years of professional experience in administrative or investigative work in a law enforcement or regulatory agency.

Possession of a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university; and one (1) year of experience in the licensing of personnel and participants of the racing industry; or, one (1) year of professional experience in administrative or investigative work in a law enforcement or regulatory agency.

<u>NOTE</u>: "Professional experience" refers to work that is creative, analytical, evaluative, and interpretive; requires a range and depth of specialized knowledge of the profession's principles, concepts, theories, and practices; and is performed with the authority to act according to one's own judgment and make accurate and informed decisions.

LICENSE: Appointees will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.

<u>PREFERENCE</u>: Preference will be given to applicants who are familiar with racing, are computer literate, have good communication skills, and the ability to work well with others and/or to applicants who are able to read, write, speak, understand, or communicate in Spanish and English sufficiently to perform the duties of this position.
