<u>DUTIES</u>: Under direction of a Deputy Executive Director of the Youth Justice Commission, assists in the overall administration and management practices of assigned component programs related to classification, intake, parole, reentry, education, placement assessments, and detention practices; oversees the resident disciplinary hearing process; provides support for special projects and agency initiatives; directs the planning, coordination, and implementation of designed programs to educate, rehabilitate, and develop youthful offenders to become productive members of society; does other related duties as required. REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree.

<u>NOTE</u>: Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute additional program experience as indicated above on a year-for-year basis for the Bachelor's degree, with thirty (30) semester hour credits being equal to one (1) year of college, and two (2) additional years of program experience for the Master's degree.

EXPERIENCE: Five (5) years of program experience in the field of juvenile justice/social work administration or coordination of community based programs in the orientation, training, treatment, education, and rehabilitation efforts of socially maladjusted and/or juvenile offenders, four (4) years of which shall have involved the management of a large scale social service agency, juvenile justice organization, or troubled adolescent outreach community services program.

LICENSE: Appointees will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.
