## **Description:**

Under direction of a supervisor in the Office of School Finance assists in the performance of education research by collecting, analyzing, and interpreting statistical data in order to meet changing education needs; develops educational programming by conducting analyses and evaluations of education programs, surveys, needs assessment, and related research; assists in the establishment, maintenance, and evaluation of program and fiscal data related to state and federal aid, grant applications, and allocation; performs mandated regulatory functions; is knowledgeable in and works with some independence in areas of assignments. Assists in the development of department databases and computerized systems; assists in planning the design, programming, and implementation of information systems; and performs other related work as required.

### **Requirements:**

Education: Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Master's degree in Public Administration, Educational Statistics and Measurement, Statistics, or a related field.

Experience: Three (3) years of experience in program evaluation, statistical analysis, or psychometrics.

Preferred Education/Experience: Knowledge in computer programming; expertise using SAS; demonstrated proficient in Excel, knowledge of ORACLE, ACCESS, and PowerPoint.
