As a member of the Center for Teaching & Learning Design, the Instructional Designer (ID) supervises assigned staff, manages course development/design processes, evaluates course design, and applies best practices related to teaching and learning in a university setting for all modes of instruction (online, hybrid, and classroom teaching).

## Responsibilities:

Under the direction of the Executive Director and in collaboration with Center for Teaching & Learning Design (CTLD) colleagues, the Instructional Designer (ID):

- Supervises assigned staff, manages course development/design processes, evaluates course design, and applies best practices related to teaching and learning in a university setting for all modes of instruction (online, hybrid, and classroom teaching)
- Manages the workflow and evaluation of online course/program development, provides individual and group faculty consultations and training sessions, and reviews and documents course development and other services provided by the CTLD
- Performs instructional design work, facilitates online faculty learning courses/modules, develops and delivers workshops (virtual and face-to-face), maintains online (website) faculty resources, and provides school/program outreach on topics related to college teaching
- Provides work progress reports, maintains instructional design records, and communicates with stakeholders to promote collaboration and accountability
- Hires and supervises student workers and TES staff
- Participates in strategic planning and the development, implementation, and assessment of CTLD goals
- Assists with the development of CTLD policies and procedures in alignment with university goals and provides direction to faculty needs assessment and outreach efforts
