An opportunity currently exists in the unclassified service with the Department of Law and Public Safety, Office of the Attorney General, for applicants who meet the requirements specified below:

TITLE:Assistant Attorney General<br/>(Of Counsel to the Solicitor General)

**SALARY:** \$172,500.00

**LOCATION:** Office of the Attorney General Office of the Solicitor General Newark <u>OR</u> Trenton, NJ Statewide travel required for work responsibilities.

**<u>NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE:</u>** One (1) – Location preference required.

**DUTIES:** Under direction of the Solicitor General, Deputy Solicitors General, and Law and Public Safety division leadership will develop legal strategy; supervise the briefing of selected appeals and dispositive motions in both federal and state courts; present oral arguments in appellate matters; assist in drafting and reviewing amicus briefs; serve as counsel to the Solicitor General, playing a key role in advocacy and litigation; oversee multiple appeals in a dynamic and fast-paced environment; and undertake related work as required. This position may also require non-traditional work hours, on an as needed basis, including evenings and weekends on short deadlines for certain assignments, with or without advance notice.

## **REQUIREMENTS**

**EDUCATION:** Graduation from an accredited law school with a Juris Doctor. Admission to practice as an Attorney at Law in the State of New Jersey is required.

**EXPERIENCE:** Four (4) years of professional legal experience as an attorney at law of the State of New Jersey in the area of the specialty or, three (3) years of professional legal experience as an attorney for State or Federal administrative agencies, which shall have involved a significant amount of the specialized legal work, or, two (2) years of unique specialized legal experience.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.

**<u>PREFERENCE</u>**: Preference will be given to applicants with over nine (9) years of relevant professional legal experience, whether serving as either an attorney at law litigating complex issues or appeals, as a judicial law clerk to a state or federal judge, or in a role\_with comparably specialized legal duties.

**SAME APPLICANTS:** If you are applying under the NJ CSC "SAME" program, your Schedule A or B letter must be submitted along with your resume and any other required supporting documents indicated on the announcement by the closing date indicated below. **RESUME NOTE:** Eligibility determinations for experience and education will be based upon the resume, employment application, including required supporting documents (JD transcripts). Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide a CSC approved evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency, with a course-by-course breakdown, prior to the closing date (see <u>CSC foreign degree information</u>). Failure to do so may result in disqualification of your education towards eligibility.

All offers of employment are conditional subject to the applicant agreeing to and then passing a background check that may include fingerprinting.
