NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: One (1)

<u>DUTIES:</u> Under the direction of a supervisory official in the Office of Public Integrity and Accountability, reviews claims submitted by convicted individuals for objectively credible and verifiable evidence of actual innocence, and investigates and prosecutes "cold case" matters with law enforcement partners. This Deputy Attorney General will provide legal advice and representation of the State on matters of a complex nature; interpret and enforce laws and regulations; participate in legal and related activities involving federal and local jurisdictions and other State entities; draft memoranda of law; handle all aspects of case litigation; serves on various task forces and working groups for the Division or LPS; work on special projects and initiatives; and perform other related work as needed. This position may also require non-traditional work hours, including evenings and weekends on short deadlines for certain assignments, with or without advance notice, to perform the aforementioned responsibilities.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited law school with a Juris Doctor. Admission to practice as an Attorney at Law in the State of New Jersey is required.

EXPERIENCE: Three (3) years of experience as a practicing attorney.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.

<u>PREFERENCE:</u> Preference will be given to candidates with significant criminal practice and trial experience; a demonstrated ability to multi-task and work effectively with a broad cross-section of stakeholders; and excellent written and oral advocacy skills.

RESUME NOTE: Eligibility determinations for experience and education will be based upon the resume, employment application, including required supporting documents (JD transcripts). Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide a CSC approved evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency, with a course-by-course breakdown, prior to the closing date (see <u>CSC foreign degree information</u>). Failure to do so may result in disqualification of your education towards eligibility.

All offers of employment are conditional subject to the applicant agreeing to and then passing a background check that may include fingerprinting.
