<u>DUTIES</u>: Under limited supervision of a Supervising Investigator or under the guidance of an Investigator 4 or other supervisory official in the Department of Law and Public Safety, Division of Consumer Affairs, performs investigations regarding complaints filed with the professional and occupational boards within the Division and guides victims/complainants through the investigative and disciplinary processes; performs other related duties required. ## **REQUIREMENTS**

**EDUCATION:** Graduation from an accredited college with a Bachelor's degree.

**EXPERIENCE:** Two (2) years of experience in the conduct of civil or criminal investigations related to compliance, enforcement, detection, and surveillance activity, including the preparation of investigative reports; **OR** two (2) years of experience in the conduct of investigative administrative audits and/or regulatory examinations of records maintained by businesses and organizations; **OR** two (2) years of experience in the conduct of investigations for the government, the military, consumer protection programs, public advocacy organizations, or the public interest.

Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute additional experience as indicated on a year-for-year basis.

Completion of a supervised internship field placement of 300 hours in an undergraduate curriculum in Criminal Justice or a related degree program may be substituted for one (1) year of the non-supervisory experience. A copy of college transcripts indicating completion of the internship as part of your undergraduate curriculum in Criminal Justice or a related field must be provided in order to meet the substitution requirement. Failure to do so may result in disqualification from consideration.

A Juris Doctorate degree or a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice, Public Administration, Business Administration, Law, or a related field may be substituted for one (1) year of the non-supervisory experience.

<u>LICENSE</u>: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is required to perform the essential duties of the position.

**RESUME NOTE:** Eligibility determinations will be based only upon information presented in resumes. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so may result in your ineligibility.

All offers of employment are conditional subject to the applicant agreeing to and then passing a background check that may include fingerprinting.
