Will review, analyze, and draft Data Use Agreement/Data Sharing Agreements (DUA/DSA) and Memorandums of Agreement/Understanding within the Division and partners outside the Division. REQUIREMENTS (EDUCATION / EXPERIENCE / LICENSES) EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited law school with a Juris Doctor (J.D.) Degree. EXPERIENCE: One (1) year of experience in conducting legal research, analyzing and evaluating legal documents, rules, regulations, and/or legislation, or the review and analysis of regulatory matters in a government agency; or one (1) year of experience as an attorney.
