Under the Office of Minority and Multicultural Health at the New Jersey Department of Health, the COVID-19 Health Educator is responsible for the development, coordination, monitoring, implementation, and evaluate COVID-19 information, education, and awareness activities for marginalized populations by using health literacy principles. The Health Educator is charged to select or develop appropriate emerging COVID-19 messages and communications to the public and specific marginalized groups, guided by prioritization, assessment, and evaluation, collaborating with key individuals, groups, or agencies. The materials in various media forms will raises awareness, educate on COVID-19 and local resources for vulnerable populations. Participate in health education planning activities for COVID-19 to create, acquire and/or augment plans, manuals, fact sheets, evaluation tools, or other materials to support disease preparedness and response. Assist in the writing of policies, protocols, grants, reports, and articles as assigned/agreed upon. Conduct or review relevant needs assessments to determine gaps in existing knowledge base and educational programs. Research and analyze appropriateness and scope of current approaches to determine best practices. Lead in the design, development, implementation, and promotion of COVID-19 prevention and mitigation education and services media (handouts, public service announcements, social media, presentations) for marginalized populations. Develops media in various languages and literacy levels, for a variety of groups and organizations. Utilize collaborative methods with other DOH programmatic leads and program staff to evaluate effectiveness of COVID- 19 education strategies Certified Health Education Specialist certifaction (CHES) Required This position may be eligible to participate in the Department's pilot telework program, which offers eligible employees the opportunity to work remotely for up to two (2) days per week, as approved by management.
