reports with appropriate finding, conclusions and recommendations, as required. Monitors COVID-19 related vaccine				
spending, vaccine distribution, and inventory management. Developes standard operating procedures and job aids.				
Performs monthly or bi-monthly COVID-19 related education training sessions for healthcare providers or the public.				
Supervises office personnel in the collection, tabulation, and analysis of data related to CVOID-19 and provides reports				
to Departmental leadership and to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). Developes and maintains partnerships with				
state, local, and other key stakeholders to discuss and resolves issues regarding the planning and development of COVID-19 vaccination activities.
