**<u>DUTIES</u>**: Under the limited supervision of a Research Data Supervisor or other supervisory official in the Department of Law and Public Safety (DL&PS) Office of Justice Data (OJD), Law Enforcement Professional Standards (OLEPS) or Juvenile Justice Commission (JJC), independently performs a variety of complex tasks which include advanced research and data analysis; collection of data, scheduled report maintenance, and statistical work in one or more programmatic or investigative areas, utilizing structured and unstructured data from existing reports and resources for statewide business improvement; does all related duties as required. ## **REQUIREMENTS**

**EDUCATION:** Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree including or supplemented by 18 credits in social sciences, criminal justice, statistics, or a closely related field.

**EXPERIENCE:** Three (3) years of experience in collecting, analyzing, reporting, and disseminating large volumes of data using statistical techniques to identify trends or patterns in complex data for research projects.

**<u>NOTE</u>**: Applicants who do not possess the required degree, but who do possess the specialized credits outlined above, may substitute additional experience for the remaining education (years necessary to complete the degree) on a year-for-year basis.

**<u>NOTE</u>**: A Master's degree in social sciences, criminal justice, statistics, or a closely related field may be substituted for one (1) year of the required experience.

**<u>NOTE</u>**: A Ph.D. in social sciences, criminal justice, statistics, or a closely related field may be substituted for two (2) years of the required experience.

**LICENSE:** Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform essential duties of the position.

**<u>RESUME NOTE</u>**: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so may result in your ineligibility.
