## NUMBER OF VACANCIES: One (1)

DUTIES: Under direct supervision of a Supervising Investigator or other supervisory official in the Department of Law and Public Safety and part of the Infrastructure Protection Unit (IPU), provides vulnerability assessments for all of New Jersey's 16 critical infrastructure sectors, as well as the critical infrastructure delineated on the NJ State Asset Data Base (SADB). Moreover, IPU operationally is responsible for conducting special event assessment reports (SEAR) prior to any and all high-profile large events identified on the Office of Homeland Security's Special Events Listings. The Office of the Superintendent, Office of the Attorney General (OAG) and the Governor rely on IPU to provide Site Assessment Visits (SAV) and/or Security Surveys, in response to both criminal, international or domestic terrorist activity. A credible site assessment team is comprised of three Subject Matter Expert's (SME), two at a minimum who can manage a project to completion.

## REQUIREMENTS

EXPERIENCE: Applicants must meet one of the following or a combination of both experience and education. Thirty (30) semester hour credits are equal to one (1) year of relevant experience. Seven (7) years of professional experience in the conduct of civil or criminal investigations related to compliance, enforcement, detection, and surveillance activity, including the preparation of investigative reports. OR Seven (7) years of professional experience in the conduct of investigative administrative audits and/or regulatory examinations of records maintained by businesses and organizations. OR Seven (7) years of professional experience in the conduct of investigations for the government, the military, consumer protection programs, public advocacy organizations, or the public interest. OR Possession of a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university; and three (3) years of the above-mentioned professional experience. OR Possession of a juris doctorate or a master's degree in Criminal Justice, Public Administration, Business Administration, Law, or a related field; and two (2) years of the above-mentioned professional experience.

<u>PREFERRED EXPERIENCE:</u> Four (4) years of experience in the area of Infrastructure Protection, including experience with vulnerability assessments for all of New Jersey's 16 critical infrastructure sectors, as well as the critical infrastructure delineated on the NJ State Asset Data Base (SADB).

NOTE: Completion of a supervised internship field placement of 300 hours in an undergraduate curriculum in Criminal Justice or a related degree program may be substituted for one (1) year of the non-supervisory experience.

NOTE: "Professional experience" refers to work that is creative, analytical, evaluative, and interpretive; requires a range and depth of specialized knowledge of the profession's principles, concepts, theories, and practices; and is performed with the authority to act according to one's own judgment and make accurate and informed decisions.

LICENSE: Appointees will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.

RESUME NOTE: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in the resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so will result in your ineligibility.

SAME APPLICANTS: If you are applying under the NJ "SAME" program, your supporting documents (Schedule A or B letter), must be submitted along with your resume by the closing date indicated above.
