GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This position will be responsible for learning to review and analyze assigned expedited review certificate of need (CN) and licensure applications, transfer of ownership, and waiver requests assigned by the Team Leader and/or the Director of Certificate of Need and Licensing (CN&L). The selected candidate will learn to process and draft decision letters. Learns to conduct research and preparation of new or revised administrative rules for CN and health care facility licensure activities. Learns to research current legislation and issues relevant to proposed legislation. Assists Team Leader, Program Manager and Director in preparation of administrative rules for presentation before the Health Care Administration Board. Learns to prepare written and oral responses to inquires regarding certificate of need and licensure regulatory policies.

This position may be eligible to participate in the Department's pilot telework program, which offers eligible employees the opportunity to work remotely for up to two (2) days per week, as approved by management.

ADVANCEMENT: Appointees who successfully complete the 12 month training period will be eligible for advancement to one of the following titles: Program Specialist 1, Program Specialist 1 (Socio-Economic Programs), Program Specialist 1 (Social/Human Services), or Program Specialist 1 (Regulatory Programs). The inability of an employee in this title to attain a level of performance warranting advancement to one of the titles listed above shall be considered as cause for separation.

REQUIREMENTS (EDUCATION / EXPERIENCE / LICENSES)

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree.

LICENSE:

NOTE: Appointees to positions assigned to the Weatherization Assistance Program in the Department of Community Affairs will be required to complete training and obtain a certification as a Quality Control Inspector, issued by an agency accredited by the United States Department of Energy (USDOE), in conformance with USDOE Weatherization Program Notice 14-4. Training is required to be successfully completed subsequent to advancement to the primary title, Program Specialist 1, Socio-Economic Programs.

Appointees will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform essential duties of the position
